I was no longer the coach, but I always shared with him one piece of advice before any tryout: Be sure to look the part. I told him that if he showed up looking like a soccer player, there was an increased chance of him being seen as a soccer player. If he showed up looking like a kid that plays soccer in video games as opposed to the real thing, he might not be taken seriously. As he grew older, that same advice was then applied to getting a job. It's advice I have heeded myself all my life. You can even say it is like another common phrase: "Fake it till you make it."





Respect Life

The Nebraska Catholic Conference has applauded the state's legislature after it passed a ban on dilation and evacuation (D&E) abortions, according to Catholic News Agency. D&E abortions are done in the second trimester and often result in the dismemberment of the unborn child. The bill-which specifically bans the use of clamps, forceps or similar instruments during abortions- passed 33-8 on August 13. Gov. Pete Ricketts signed it into law two days later. "Life has won today in Nebraska," said Marion Miner, associate director for Pro-Life and Family at the Nebraska Catholic Conference. The

Guttmacher Institute reports that 11 states have passed bans on D&E abortions. We pray that other states may follow and recognize the horrific practice of abortion for what it is: The intentional killing of a child.
