

Each year our Confirmation students would gather to work on a dozen or so hand-tied blankets to give to the needy. This year, since we were restricted due to Covid, an email went out to all the 8th, 9th & 10th grade families asking for help. It was suggested that perhaps the families could work together and make a blanket for Assumption Food Pantry. Sister Dolly was delighted when we asked if she could use a few blankets.

Fast forward to this past Saturday - an email went out to the same families saying that there would be a drop-off of any blankets made from 11:00 - noon. The first candidate to show up was Ally Putnam and her Mom Jen. Ally had made 6 blankets for Assumption and her Mom explained that she made 6 more for another outreach project!! I was only thinking that perhaps I would get a dozen or so. By noon on Saturday, my car was overfilled with 75 handmade fleece blankets!!! There was not room for one more blanket in my car as my husband and I drove down to Assumption. Sister Dolly met us there and was just overwhelmed with gratitude. She told us how these blankets would be given out at their Christmas give-a-way. She also commented on how blankets were so needed by those who come to the Pantry.

I have said this for 8 years now, the families of this community, which now includes St. Patrick's & St. Bridget's and St. Charles-St. Ann's, are the most generous and giving families!! So many of the teens said how much they enjoyed making this and many of them worked together with their families. Thank you to all the students and their families, may God continue to teach us ways to help those in need and ways to see the face of Christ in each person we meet.

HOW TO CREATE YOUR ONLINE GIVING ACCOUNT

It's as easy as 1 2 3 to create your account online right on our parish website.

- 1 Visit www.stcharles-stanns.com and click Give Online.
- 2 Click on the collection you wish to donate to.
- 3 Click Recurring Donation, enter your donation amount and frequency.

It's that easy! Your account will be created & you can start giving online.

Frequently Asked Questions

- **Q. Is giving online safe?**
A. Yes. We implement the safest security standards for online transactions and your privacy is protected at all times. It is actually more secure than writing checks or bringing cash to church. Online contributions cannot be lost, stolen, or destroyed and have an extremely high rate of accuracy.
- **Q. Which payment methods are accepted?**
A. You have many options. Contributions from checking accounts, savings accounts, debit cards, and major credit cards (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express) are all accepted.
- **Q. When will my account(s) be debited?**
A. The choice is yours. When you enroll in our online program you can choose to have donations processed Weekly, Monthly, Semimonthly, Quarterly, Semiannually, or Annually.
- **Q. What will my credit card statement say?**
A. The name of our parish will appear on your bank or credit card statement.
- **Q. Can any additional funds be taken from my account other than what I have authorized?**
A. Absolutely not! Only the amount you authorized to give the church is taken. You are the only one that can change the amount of money that may be processed. You will also receive email reminders 2 days before your recurring transaction is set to occur so there will be no surprises.
- **Q. What if I need to stop, increase, or decrease my donation?**
A. You can make changes to your account at any time by logging into your account online 24/7 or by calling the parish office.
- **Q. What if I change bank accounts or get a new debit or credit card?**
A. Log in to your account online. You can log in to your account online at any time to update your payment source information.
- **Q. Will I receive receipts for my donations?**
A. Yes. All parishioners enrolled in online giving will receive receipts via email.
- **Q. What if I feel uncomfortable not having something to physically drop into the collection basket?**
A. Don't worry! You can print donation slips that can be placed into the collection basket as a visible sign of your electronic donations. These slips can be personalized with your Name and Church ID.
- **Q. How do I sign up to start donating online?**
