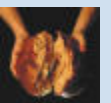

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

Why are Catholic and Protestant Bibles different?

Answer:

Since the earliest days of the Church, Christians used a Greek translation of the Old Testament known as the Septuagint. This collection of the texts of the Hebrew Scriptures included 46 books. At the time of the Protestant Reformation in the 1500s, the Protestant reformers began to create their own translations of the Bible (into local languages) and some began to question why the Jewish Scriptures would have included texts that were written in Greek, because, they assumed, the only valid Jewish Scriptures would have been written in Hebrew. And so, they decided to remove seven books from the Old Testament: Baruch, Sirach, 1 and 2 Maccabees, Tobit, Judith and Wisdom (as well as portions of the Books of Daniel and Esther). This means that the Protestant Old Testament only includes 39 books, while Catholic Bibles continue to include those original 46 books. Both Catholic and Protestant Bibles include 27 books and letters in the New Testament.

ATTENTION ST. CHARLES- ST. ANN ALTAR SERVERS

Both Father Kevin and I miss having you as part of our liturgy each weekend!! Know that you and your families have definitely been in our thoughts and prayers. During the month of August, I will start training new servers (those who have made First Eucharist and anyone older, too.), and Katie Boyea will put together a formal schedule that will, hopefully, start in **September 2021**. There may be a few minor changes in procedures due to the pandemic. We will definitely inform you of those changes before we **formally** start up again.

At the present time, any server who has been attending Mass or plans to be at Mass, and would like to serve may do so, provided that the following criteria are met:

1. Give me a call during the week or email me to let me know that you will be at Mass and would like to serve at either the 5:15 or 10:30 Mass (315-468-2283 or aparatorel@verizon.net).
2. Be at church at least five minutes before Mass.
3. We cannot have any more than three servers at one time, **so first call, first serve each week.**
4. At this time, servers will simply vest before Mass, process in with Cross and candles (single file), and one of you will ring the bells at the kneeler, and at the end of Mass, servers will process out (single file) with the Cross and candles. Of course masks must be worn and social distancing must be maintained. Even though what you do as servers has changed, know that your prayerful service is missed and appreciated and does make a difference in our liturgy!!!

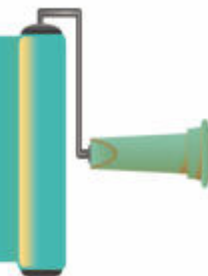
