





Some information pertaining to liturgies at St. Charles-St. Ann

To our Lectors: Please note that we will now be using the Ambo in the sanctuary to proclaim the readings. We will no longer be using the lectern in the choir section.

In Regard to Communion: The Church's norm, as you know, for receiving Communion is to process up to the front of the church. If you are unable to walk to the front, a Eucharistic minister will now come to the benches in the back to bring you Holy Communion.

To our Altar Servers: At the end of August, I will start training new servers (those who have made First Eucharist and anyone older, too), and Katie Boyea will put together a formal schedule in September 2021. Fr. Kevin and I can't wait to have you all back serving again!!!!

Respect Life
