

Archbishop Cordileone urges Catholics to support Texas law

Archbishop Salvatore J. Cordileone of San Francisco said that he was dismayed by the reactions to Texas' new restrictive abortion law by pro-abortion politicians who "are self-professed Catholics." In an op-ed published by the Washington Post, he likened the issue of abortion to the civil rights movement and held up as an example the actions taken by the late-Archbishop Joseph Rummel of New Orleans, "who courageously confronted the evils of racism" by, among other things, excommunicating notable "opponents of desegregation." Archbishop Cordileone wrote: "Was that wrong? Was that weaponizing the Eucharist? No. Rummel recognized that prominent, high profile public advocacy for racism was scandalous: It violated core Catholic teachings and basic principles of justice and also led others to sin."
