# Hope appeal Update as of February 27, 2022

I would like to thank everyone who has graciously made a donation to the Hope Appeal this year. I truly appreciate your generosity. As a parish we have collected \$26,350.00 toward our assessed amount of \$34,793.05. We are still short \$8,343.05 of our assessment. The Hope appeal campaign completed on December 31, 2021. ### Respect Life

During a meeting with the European Parliament in Strasbourg, France, on Jan. 19, French President Emmanuel Macron called for abortion to be added to the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights. The charter, which was ratified in 2000, recognizes that "everyone has the right to life" and rejects the use of the death penalty, but there is no mention of abortion. In his address, Macron said, "I hope that we can update this charter, notably to be more explicit on environmental protection or the recognition of the right to abortion." In June 2021, the European Parliament voted in favor of a report describing abortion as essential health care. We urge leaders in the EU to stand firm in their resolution to defend the God-given right to life for all humans from conception to natural death.

Here are a few ideas to consider:


- 1. Turn off the TV, computer and cell phone.


