## St. Patrick and St. Brigid Hope Appeal Assessment

2022 HOPE Appeal. Our assessment is 35,669.15. This is an increase of 976.10 over last year. As you know our assessment is based on our parish regular income. It seems like everything has been increasing from groceries to gas, just to name a few common items. Unfortunately that is the same for the many services that are offered through the HOPE Appeal. This year the HOPE Appeal requirement is back to normal. We will be expected as a parish to pay our full assessment. The full amount of our assessment is due by December 31, 2022. That gives us only 16 weeks. If each family gave a donation to HOPE Appeal of \$70. which is roughly \$4.38 per week we would definitely meet our goal. This is the same equivalent to a cup of coffee from Dunkin or Starbucks, and less than a pint of Guinness from a local establishment, just to put it into perspective.


The Rosary will be recited after morning Masses during the week. Consider staying and praying the rosary for peace.
