

"Jesus Christ called—and you obeyed!" These words were spoken by Rev. Francis C. Sheedy at the celebration of the first Mass of St. Ann's Parish. The Mass was attended by 339 people.

All of them listened to Father's inspiring message in which he stressed the "rare privilege of creating a brand new parish for the greater honor and glory of God." Most decided to meet the challenge.

And meet the challenge they did. Where the church was built, the parish worshipped their Creator, educated their children and buried their dead. On October 22, 1956 Bishop Walter A. Foery presided over the High Mass of Dedication with Father Sheedy as celebrant. Three years later, on October 15, 1959 ground was broken for the school and convent. Five years later on October 2, 1965 a gymnasium and addition to the school and convent were dedicated.

The people of St. Ann's deserve special recognition on this day. They have met every challenge whether it occurred last week or years ago. No task has been too difficult, no burden too heavy, no sacrifice too much.

Today, we celebrate and give thanks for all that has been at St. Ann's.

We rejoice in in the blessings we have received through this parish, and we remember in a special way the pastors, priests, deacons, religious, teachers and staff who served St. Ann's with faith, vision, and generosity all these years.

May we go forward from this building and community with gratitude and hope for the future instilled in our hearts.

The Rosary will be recited after morning Masses during the week. Consider staying and praying the rosary for peace.




