


Carnivale and Mardi Gras celebrations are linked to Ash Wednesday, Lent, fast and abstinence. Can you tell us more about the connections between these events?

Answer:

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the forty days known as Lent. Every year, Christians highlight this penitential season as a time of self-examination, reformation of one's life, and continued development of a deeper spiritual life. The recommended practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving become the focus of Lenten activity and ritual. Each of these spiritual practices is aimed at personal discipline as well as continued concern for the other, especially the poor or alienated.

Forty days is a symbolic biblical period of time, during which personal transformation occurs and out of which people surface as more spiritual, ready to carry out God's mission. Relying on God's providence and care, no matter how difficult life becomes, is crucial to Lenten spirituality. Fasting was initially stricter, permitting only one simple meal a day without meat, fish, or other delicacies. Such things were not even allowed in the house.

In order to prepare for this in an age of no refrigeration, people gathered to consume whatever was not allowed during Lent. This led to parties or celebrations originally referred to as Carnivale, literally meaning "goodbye to meat," or Mardi Gras, literally meaning "Fat Tuesday." The eating and celebrating ended on the Tuesday just before Ash Wednesday. Today we focus more on moderation in all things, as well as a strong concern the poor.


From the "Caring Community Group"

The Vigil is a beautiful prayer service for peace centered around the rosary prayed in 6 different languages. The 5 decades will be prayed in 5 languages focused on peace in those troubled countries. We will also have an American Sign Language interpreter signing the entire service for the Deaf Community. Our ASL interpreter, Amber Renzi, is sponsored by the Deaf Ministry of the Diocese of Syracuse. Last year, everyone commented on how the interpreter was the one common universal language and how powerful it was to watch her sign the prayers.

The Vigil will include various reflections by St. Mother Teresa, Martin Luther King, Jr. and Maya Angelou. Brianna Bengert and Nick Godzak will provide the music and lead us in songs of peace. Luminary bags and decorations were made by our Faith Formation Students.

We again are overjoyed to have the Spanish Rosary Group from St. Anthony of Padua and the Prayer Group from St. John the Baptist Ukrainian Church join us. Father Peter Major and Deacon Aleu Tong will recite the decade in Arabic and we will also have one decade prayed in Hebrew.

Sister Eileen will lead us in our closing prayer. Please mark your calendars and come help us storm the heavens in our prayer for Peace. The Rosary is our greatest weapon in our battle for peace In the world.


