

What do you put in a Polish Easter basket for blessing?

Swieconka - Easter Baskets

A traditional Polish Easter basket for blessing, or "Święconka," typically includes symbolic foods like decorated Easter eggs, bread, butter, cheese, ham, sausage, salt, and horseradish, all representing different aspects of the Easter celebration.

Here's a more detailed breakdown of what you'll typically find in a Polish Easter basket:

Easter Eggs (Pisanki): These are a symbol of new life and resurrection, often decorated with intricate patterns.

Bread (Chleb): Represents the body of Christ and the bread of life.

Butter (Masło): Often shaped like a lamb or a cross, symbolizing the Lamb of God and goodwill.

Cheese (Ser): Represents moderation and is a symbol of the end of Lent.

Ham (Szynka): Symbolizes joy and abundance, and is a staple of the Easter meal.

Sausage (Kielbasa): Represents God's favor and generosity.

Salt (Sól): Symbolizes purification and prosperity. **Horseradish** (Chrzan): Represents the bitter sacrifice of Christ.

Candle (Swieczka): Represents the light of the world.

Babka (Easter Bread): A sweet, yeasted cake, often with raisins, symbolizing the sweetness of life and abundance.

Linen Cloth: The basket is often lined with a linen cloth, which is symbolic of the shroud that covered the body of Jesus in the tomb.

Ribbons and Greenery: Used to decorate the basket as symbols of new life and joy in the season of spring.
